3rd Annual BFit First Responder Challenge



This year's BFit First Responder Challenge hosted by The Boston Bruins Foundation wrapped up as a major success in fundraising for the Club. 730 participants (including 173 civilians) ran the course. We had 123 teams from cities and towns across the Commonwealth all coming together to raise \$430,000 for the Club.

The Boston Bruins Foundation has catapulted the Club into a successful level of fundraising, and we are honored to be a part of their team. In only three years, we have raised approximately \$900,000 from this Event.

National Grid was once again the lead sponsor of the Event, and we are grateful for their continued generosity. Under Armour was also a substantial sponsor. But we couldn't have done it without all of the sponsors, participants and everyone who came together to make it happen.

Winning BFit Teams

The Boston Police Runners Club raised over \$50,000 with Cecil Jones, a Boston Police Officer, being the highest individual fundraiser for the Event. The winner in the fire division was Worcester Local 1019 raising over \$38,000.
