

Developer pushes to replace Weymouth building with 2 chain restaurants

WEYMOUTH — The new owner of the former Factory Point site at Route 1B and Pond Street is planning two new buildings to house a Starbucks coffee shop and a Chipotle Mexican Grill.

Pond Street Acquisitions, LLC, has submitted an application for a special permit for the proposed project at 255 Pond St. and 157 Main St., which together total just more than 2 acres. The zoning board of appeals will start the public hearing on the project at its May 17 meeting.

The developer wants to knock down the 40,000-square-foot warehouse building that was previously a Factory Point and Decoding store, as well as an unoccupied single-family home. The proposal would then add two new buildings totaling 17,000 square feet. Factory Point closed in 2009 after 75 years in business, and the building has been vacant since.

The site would also have a drive-through lane, a mobile order pick-up window and an outdoor seating area, along with 12 parking spaces. There are 26 spots in the lot currently.


